Award 2018

On 10th July 1957, the first success in induced breeding of fish in India was achieved by Dr. Hiralal Chaudhuri with the support from Dr. K.H. Alikunhi. This pioneering work on induced breeding technology over the years led to aqua-explosion in the country principally through quality major carp seed production and supply to fish farmers from hundreds of fish hatcheries across the country. As a result, today India ranks second in global fish production. In order to commemorate this day, Govt. of India in 2001 declared 10th July as the "National Fish Farmers Day". This also happens to be the Foundation Day of National Fisheries Development Board (NFDB). NFDB has institutionalized awards in nine categories to felicitate the outstanding fish farmers on this day every year in recognition to their accomplishments in innovation, development and adoption of improved technologies and practices in fish farming. Under each category, there are two awards (1st & 2nd position). The awardees will be felicitated with a trophy, shawl, certificate, citation and a cash prize of Rs. 51,000 for 1st position and Rs. 21,000 for the 2nd position.

SHRI CHETHI SRI RAMULU is a successful hatchery owner and seed grower in Telangana State. In the year 1996, he established a fish seed hatchery comprising of two breeding pools and three incubation chambers. Each incubation chamber has a production capacity of 1.5 crore spawn/day with a success rate of about 90%. Today, he produced around 250-300 crore spawn annually contributing significantly to the fish seed requirement of the State. He is also a seed grower supplying quality fish fingerlings as stocking material for larger water bodies.

SHRI PRAHLAD CHAUDHARY is an innovative hatchery owner and seed grower from Jharkhand. He is engaged in various aquaculture activities for many years. He is involved in fish culture in small reservoirs and Govt. tanks of around 200 ha with an average production of 400 tonnes per annum. He regularly exports fish to neighbouring state of Bihar. He owns a hatchery from which he produces 10 million spawn annually. He is engaged in raising the fish fingerlings and distributing it to the farmers. He also owns a pick-up vehicle supported by NFDB for transporting fish seed. Presently, he is the Secretary of the local fishermen co-operative society and acts as Matsya Mitra for the State of Jharkhand.

SHRI U.K. VISWANADHA RAJU is a Social Entrepreneur and a leading industrialist in the field of Fisheries, Aquaculture and other allied agribusiness activities with an annual group turnover of about Rs. 1000 crores. He is a leading exporter of processed fishery products to the USA, Canada, European Union, Japan, Middle East, etc. from his three modern Processing Plants approved by EU & USFDA. He has revolutionized the concept of "fish packaging" from bamboo baskets to plastic crates/boxes to Styrofoam boxes for transport of fresh & chilled fish. He also created a new brand of ready-to-eat fishery products, the "Nutrifish" which is now catching momentum and available in almost all major cities. He constructed the first Govt. approved shrimp farm in India in 1986 at Losari, Bhimavaram, which paved the way for the development of shrimp farming in the State. He is instrumental for the development of freshwater prawn culture in India and established the first commercial freshwater prawn hatchery at Bhimavaram in 1990 with a capacity of 40 million seed/annum. He established India's first and only Organic E.U Certified & BAP (Best Aquaculture Practice) approved Black Tiger shrimp hatchery at Andhra Pradesh and West Bengal.

SHRI V. RAMACHANDRA RAJU, an innovator, farmer and entrepreneur working in the Aquaculture industry for past 30 years. He has fish farms in Andhra Pradesh and Odisha wherein he produced 10 metric tonnes/ha of ponds by following BMP (Best Management Practices) for monitoring quality of water and supplementary feeding. He is also the Director of M/s Swapna Sudha Aqua Farmers (P) Ltd., Odisha and M/s Helapuri Proteins and Foods (P) Ltd., Andhra Pradesh. He is actively involved in technology and fisheries development programs and is a consultant to various Fisheries Associations, Govt. Departments and Private Institutions. SHRI MANORANJAN SAHU is a progressive fish farmer and entrepreneur from Baisinga, district Mayurbhanj, Odisha. He owns multi-species hatchery in 1.3 acre area and a farm of 100 acres. His hatchery is the largest fish hatchery complex in Odisha and is recognised as a Farm school under Ministry of Skill Development, Govt. of India. It has facilities like training hall, audiovisual room and accommodation buildings for trainees. The hatchery carried out breeding of 25 varieties of fish including many indigenous species and scampi. He produced around 250 lakh spawn, 100 lakh fry and 60 tonnes of fingerlings annually from that hatchery. His Centre "Kailash Fisheries" maintains a close link with Department of Fisheries, Govt. of Odisha and act as facilitator for learning and innovation of fish farmers in the localities.


SHRI S. VAITHEESWARAN, a fishery professional, established Svara Biotechnovations in the year 2011 with Shri S. Alagu Ravi. He has more than three decades of experience in establishing and running large industrial scale Tilapia production facilities in India and abroad. In the same year, he established intensive pond culture unit for mono-sex tilapia at Therku Pethampatti village in Madurai and Tilapia Hatchery at Natham Village, Dindigul with financial support from NFDB. The hatchery produces Chitralada and GIFT strains of Nile Tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) and Red Tilapia (*Oreochromis sp.*). Svara Biotechnovations is the only facility in the country having three high value genetic resource of Tilapia. The HDPE geomembrane lined intensive nursery and grow-out ponds with RAS facilities produce about 25 tonnes of tilapia per acre water spread area per annum. The produced fish is marketed live year-round, to provide the customers' best quality protein while the farm realizes maximum value for its product.



He owns a small scale Pabda hatchery and produce an appreciable quantity of Pabda seed. With his own interest and with the help of the Tripura Fisheries Dept., he designed his own farm pond which is highly bio-secured. Shri Datta is also a pioneer in culture of GIFT strain of tilapia in the State with assistance from the State Fishery Dept. and RGCA. He is also trained in various fisheries and aquaculture programmes. He also started Duck-cum-Fish culture which serves as a training site for the students of College of Fisheries, Lembucherra, Tripura.

SHRI NAOREM LASHMON SINGH of Imphal West District, Manipur, started artificial breeding and seed production of an indigenous and high valued catfish - Meitei Ngakra (*Clarias magur*) in 2005. He started in a small scale breeding system with limited facilities. In 2009, he standardized the breeding of Magur using FRP Hatchery with a production of 2 lakh seeds annually. He undertakes integrated fish culture with water mimosa (*Neptunia prostate*) and livestock in his 2 ha. fish farm which has increased his yield and income. His farm is run by his family members. His keen interest, determination and tireless efforts in popularization of breeding and culture of Magur has bagged him many awards.

SHRI AMULYA KUMAR DAS is a fish farmer of distinction from Tripura State. Virtually as a novice but with devotion, he stepped into fish culture over two decades back. Subsequently, he secured a firm foothold in the culture fishery sector of Tripura. His debut into the fish seed production sector was through import of major carp spawn into Tripura from Bangladesh, for supply to farmers and stocking his own ponds. From this stage, he progressed to the point of raising healthy major carp fry, and utilized the same not only for stocking his own ponds of 2 ha but also for supplying to a set of farmers who emulated him. He undertook extensive trips to West Bengal to learn about induced breeding of Major Carps in order to get rid of the problem of spawn shortage. He set up his own eco-hatchery and expanded his farm with integrated approach. He is the first private fish breeder and seed supplier in the state.

Realising the potential and opportunity, the Govt. of Gujarat allotted 5000 ha of brackishwater land to the farmers. He introduced the concept of satellite shrimp farming in Gujarat. He is a strong believer of low stocking module for the Pacific white shrimp (*Litopenaeus vannamei*) and his concept of "Farming vannamei the tiger way" is gaining popularity, not only in India but also in other countries. He has motivated many shrimp farmers to take up sustainable model of shrimp farming. Presently, he is also the Director of Mayank Aquaculture Pvt. Ltd.

The quality of the seed is monitored at different stages of growth with latest quality control equipment. As a part of corporate social responsibility, he is extending humanitarian service for the people of neighboring villages.

BHAKRA FISHERIES INDUSTRIAL COOPERATIVE SOCIETY is registered under cooperative societies Act 1968 on 20th December, 1979. The society is operating in Gobind Sagar reservoir and is managed by the Department of Fisheries, Himachal Pradesh. The society runs fish landing Centre in Bilaspur district and has become highest fish catching society with as high as 98.82 MT fish catch during 2014-15. Presently, the society has a total membership of 360, out of which 118 are active fishermen holding regular fishing license. Governing body of the society comprises of a President, Vice President, Cashier and 4 members, who with active participation of fishermen look after the business of the society. The landing centers are provided with basic amenities like adequate and permanent drinking water supply and well-furnished toilets.
