## World Fisheries Day 2019: Awards Ceremony

"Unifying working fishermen and women from all over the globe was the purpose for the World Forum of Fish Harvesters & Fish Workers that came together in New Delhi on 21st November 1997. On that day, the World Fisheries Forum (WFF) was established and fishing representatives from 18 countries signed a declaration advocating for a global mandate of sustainable fishing practices and policies.

To commemorate this day, the 21st November is celebrated every year as World Fisheries Day. NFDB has institutionalized awards in different categories to felicitate the outstanding fish farmers on this day in recognition of their accomplishments in innovation, development and adoption of improved technologies and practices in fish farming. The Awardees will be felicitated with a memento, shawl, certificate, citation and a cash prize of Rs. 10,000 /- for the 1st position and Rs. 5,000/- for the 2nd position."



# Best Fish Farmer - Inland States (Freshwater)





# **Shri Sandeep Pardesi**

**Award: 2nd Position** 



### Citation

Shri Sandeep Pardesi, is a progressive fish farmer from Indore, Madhya Pradesh. He started fish farmingin the name of "Mangalmurti Farms and Fisheries". in a 2.5 ha farm with 2 ponds of 1000 sq ft each. He popularized intensive culture of Pangasius and IMC and obtained an yield of 111.788 tonnes/annum with profit of Rs. 41 lakh. He achieved high production and productivity by following Best Management Practices and bio-security measures. He engages unemployed youth on his farm and extends guidance and hand-holding support to the neighboring fish farmers. His dedication to fisheries has brought him many laurels and he emerged as a role model for fellow farmers.

## **Shri Bairi Pattabhi**

## Citation

Shri Bairi Pattabhi of Warangal district, Telangana established fish hatchery in an area of 8.00 ha having production capacity of 80 crore spawn. He has successfully breed 4 different fish species at his farm, viz. Catla, Rohu, Common Carp and Mrigal and supplied spawn to fish farmers in Telangana and neighbouring States. He adopts Best Management Practices which has helped him to achieve a target of 60 crore spawn production annually. Apart from this, he also provides employment to 15 local youth in his hatchery.

## Citation

Shri Subhodh Ch. Das is a successful hatchery owner and seed grower from Deocherra, Tripura. In the year 1990, he established a fish seed hatchery for carps in 4 ha area having a capacity of 190 crore spawn/year capacity. His production of 170 crore spawn per annum has immensely contributed to the fish seed requirement of the State. He is also a seed grower supplying quality fish fingerlings as stocking material for larger water bodies of Tripura and other neighboring States. He achieved high production and productivity through use of Best Management Practices and bio-security measures.

Shri Chapala Mutteswararao is an innovative fish farmer of Andhra Pradesh producing 0.6 tonne/3-4 months from his 0.96 ha Mud Crab Farm. Shri Sathi Suryanarayana Reddy of Andhra Pradesh is the owner of a chain of 18 hatcheries of Litopenaeus vannamei. His Srirampuram Shrimp Hatchery has a production capacity of 180 million/annum. He supplies L. vannamei seed to shrimp farmers of Orissa, West Bengal, Gujarat, Goa, Haryana and Andhra Pradesh. As part of his Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), he extends humanitarian service to the people of neighboring villages.

# Hatchery Manager – Matsyafed

## Citation

Matsyafed has a registered shrimp hatchery located at Thirumullavaram of Kollam district in Kerala that was established during 2009. The unit has 300 no. of healthy brood stock of Penaeus monodon and produces and supplies around 30 million PL/year to different States. The Hatchery is well equipped with brooders holding facilities and laboratory along with PCR diagnosis for health monitoring and management.

## Citation

Matsyafed having 652 primary fishermen development welfare co-operative societies established 37 retail fish outlets in Kerala. Its main objective is to support the fish vendors and fishermen in procurement and marketing of fish to ensure supply of quality fish. It has a total annual turnover of Rs. 35 crore and handles around 7 tonne of fish per day. Matsyafed also provides financial credit to fishers for undertaking fishing operations.

# **Jampeta Fish Market**

#### Citation

Jampeta Wholesale Fish Market at Rajamahendravaram district of Andhra Pradesh was established with the financial assistance of National Fisheries Development Board during 2013. At present there are 120 retail shops and 12 wholesale fish vendors handling around 6.28 tonne of fish per day. The Fish Market is equipped with all basic amenities such as water supply, proper electrification, drainage facility and toilets which make it a hygienic and clean market.



# Best Backyard RAS Farmer







## **Smt. Lisha Mathew**

#### Citation

Smt. Lisha Mathew being a school teacher by profession has adopted Backyard RAS Technology by setting up 2 units of RAS under NFDB scheme in late 2018. She is well trained in RAS technology by Cochin University of Science and Technology and also provides guidance and support to other Backyard RAS farmers. Through Best Management Practices and skill, production from her two RAS units was 7200 kg in one year and earned a profit of Rs. 8.40 lakh.

#### Citation

Smt. Beena Johny being a housewife, has set up a Backyard RAS unit with financial assistance from NFDB in the late 2018 at her own house. She is culturing Genetically Improved farmed Tilapia (GIFT) and achieved a production of 1600 kg fish/per crop, since inception. Smt. Beena Johny has earned a profit of Rs.1.80 lakh just by sparing a few hours time daily for management of RAS unit. Through this little effort, Smt. Beena Johny is inspiring other women to take up RAS fish culture in their backyard.

## **COFFED, Patna**

### Citation

Aqua-One Center: Co-operative Fisheries Federation (COFFED), Patna was established in 2018 with the financial assistance from National Fisheries Development Board as a Special Purpose Vehicle for providing services to the aquafarmers. It has registered 130 farmers and is providing services covering 128 ha farm area. It also provides water sampling, diagnostic and advisory service to the farmers. COFFED Aqua-One Center had also undertaken 22 demonstrations of culturing improved varieties of fish in Bihar.

Aqua-One Center: National Centre for Sustainable Aquaculture (NaCSA) of Konithiwada Revenue Village, West Godavari district was established with financial assistance from National Fisheries Development Board during 2018. It provides technical services and hand-holding support to aquafarmers. NaCSA has registered 715 no. of farmers and has provided services over 686 ha farm area. NaCSA Aqua-One Center is acting as a stepping stone in increasing the fish production by transforming conventional farming system to scientific fish farming.
